Come along and join in a basketball coaching session with a top coach, bring along your own ball. How many baskets can you get out of 10? All ages ... join in a match. Come along and join the fun



WORTHYS LOCAL HISTORY GROUP



An A4 52page booklet has been published describing the pillboxes and other fortifications that were built for the defence of the Worthy Down airfield during World War 2. Pillboxes, retractable forts and other surviving contemporary structures have been recorded and are described in detail with technical drawings and photographs. Their exact locations, tactical disposition and strategic significance are also described.

As well as being of local interest, the booklet will appeal to those interested in military history, the Fleet Air Arm, airfield defences, and World War 2 early strategic thinking. Price £4 +P&P

It is there for your use—how can we help you do this?



Quarterly Financial Update (April-June)

At the end of June, September, December and March a summary of the Parish Council's financial position will be published openly on www.theworthys.org.uk

1. Income




Income totalled £31,812 for the quarter ending 30 June. This was £1,102 higher than our budget. For the same period last year the income was £30,459.

Principal sources of income are the precept (£27,961), pitch fees (£1,335) and burial ground income £1,569. The latter two items were higher than expected for the quarter.

2. Expenditure


Total expenditure for the quarter was £26,700. This was £1,766 lower than our budgeted amount. In the same period last year expenditure was £23,680. The main categories of expenditure are shown in the chart



The increase in expenditure compared to the same period last year is principally attributable to projects completed late in 2010/11 and paid in the current year. Also our insurance premium of £3,349 was paid in full rather than spread over 12 months. The cost of insurance in 2011/12 will be approximately £2,000 less than the previous year.

3. Assets Held and Movements

The red bars on the bar graph highlight an increase in two of the three categories of monetary assets held by Kings Worthy Parish Council during the last 3 months



S106. Open Spaces Funds which are held on our behalf by Winchester City Council have increased by £13,205 to £74,402 over the last 3 months. £5,000 of the increase is a result of a contribution received from Headbourne Worthy Parish Council as a contribution towards the multi use games area in Eversley Park. We shall shortly have to pay £47,233 for this new facility. Other funds in this category are received through levies on new properties. Any monies received can only be used for sport/play facilities.

Earmarked funds have remained constant over the quarter at £40,691. These funds are held specifically to provide lifetime maintenance of Church Green and Broadview

Net assets (principally held with our bankers) have increased by £2,735 as a result of income for the quarter being higher than expenditure.
